

a thank you message from our Chair

Thank you for supporting the St Mary's Foundation during our School's Centenary year.

I am delighted to report that together, we raised more than \$345,000 for our Scholarship, Building and Library Funds throughout 2021. The impact of this generosity will be felt for many years to come and will help us support the next generation of St Mary's women.

The Foundation was delighted to give a Centenary gift of \$300,000 to the School to develop an adventure challenge course, including a low ropes course and a mountain biking and walking trail, as well as a bush chapel, at St Mary's Metricup: The Lady Treatt Centre for Learning and Leadership. Further to this, it was announced at the end of last year that the Foundation had provided the funds to facilitate the purchase of 43 hectares of property adjoining the original Metricup property for \$1.7 million, to build on its initial purchase of land in 2005.

We are immensely proud of our Class of 2021, who honoured the wishes of our late Centenary Head Girl, Sally Hicks, by founding a wonderful new scholarship called the *Spirit of St Mary*'s for their leaving gift to the School. The Foundation, inspired by the community's generosity, donated an additional \$26,800 to the scholarship and committed to supporting this scholarship into future years.

It was my absolute privilege to become the new Chair of the St Mary's Foundation in 2021. On behalf of the St Mary's Foundation Board of Management, I would like to thank you for your ongoing support of the School.

Every donation, no matter the size, has an impact and is vital to our future of providing an inspiring education for our girls.

Perspective

Thank you sincerely for connecting with St Mary's during our Centenary year and for your ongoing, outstanding generosity. As we commence a new century of discovery, we continue to honour our past while also looking ahead to what the future holds for St Mary's Anglican Girls' School.

Through the immense generosity of our extended community, including Old Girls, past and present parents, and past and present staff, we have continued to grow our scholarship, building and library funds to help current and future generations of St Mary's students to flourish. With a renewed purpose, 'to engage hearts and ignite curious minds', we are turning our focus to improving facilities via our St Mary's Masterplan 2019-2030 and increasing opportunities for deserving young girls to attend this wonderful school.

As part of our centenary celebrations, we were delighted to name our new perimeter access road Atkins Drive in honour of Mr Peter Atkins, who was a member of the

Board of Governors from 1955 to 1983 and was Chairman from 1962 to 1971. Peter played a key role in raising the necessary funds to acquire the magnificent 16 hectares that the School is now located on. We were also pleased to develop a greenspace to provide better connection between the Junior and Senior Schools; we look forward to the ongoing development of this project.

I am pleased to report that the construction of our Creative Arts and Design Centre began recently, with an anticipated completion date in late 2023. This exciting project marks the most significant capital project since the School was relocated to Karrinyup in the 1960s. The building will house innovative and inspiring spaces for

visual arts, wearable art, design technologies (textiles) and media studies. The ground floor will also include an expansive multipurpose space that can be used for social functions, examinations and large group meetings.

With construction now under way on our Creative Arts and Design Centre, we can begin planning our next exciting project, a new Science and Technology Centre.





Scholarship

Inspired by the 2020 Kaartdijin Scholarship, another benevolent member of our St Mary's community approached the School with a vision to fund another life-changing scholarship for a local Indigenous student.

The Balanginy Kadadjiny Scholarship – Balanginy meaning 'to pursue' and Kadadjiny meaning 'thinking, listening and learning' – was established with the intent to fund a deserving Indigenous student's entire secondary education.

Following a series of tests and interviews, Maddison Collard was awarded the Scholarship and started Year 7 at St Mary's in 2022.

Scholarship ignites Old Girl's passion

2021 Bonny Milne Scholar

Hannah Haddon (Coopes '16), our 2021 Bonny Milne Scholarship for Medicine recipient, recently relocated to Derby, about 2.5 hours from Broome, to continue her studies at the Rural Clinical School of Western Australia (RCSWA). We caught up with the third-year medical student to find out what she has been up to and how she is utilising her scholarship.


When applying for the Bonny Milne Scholarship, there were a few uncertainties in the air. Would I be able to sustain living in the Kimberley? Would it be feasible to relocate, leaving behind my beloved work at St Mary's boarding house? When I was awarded the scholarship, it gave me complete certainty to apply for the prestigious RCSWA program, knowing that I had support behind me to relocate 2197km north.

The scholarship has assisted in providing basic daily living support, alleviated the pressure of not being able to work, and, subsequently, enabled me to contribute my time outside of university to the community. It has also allowed me to access some vital educational resources while up here, including an AMBOSS medical note subscription and the best illustrated anatomy palm cards. I can say with complete certainty that I would not have been able to relocate to Derby without this much-appreciated support.

Living in Derby and working at the community hospital has fuelled my passion for working rurally and has solidified my goal of entering the Fellowship in Advanced Rural General Practice pathway, a rural GP speciality which will enable me to work both in a general practice and an emergency department setting. Life in Derby is exciting, rapidly evolving and community-centric. Some highlights have included helping to manage some high acuity situations, including a complex respiratory patient requiring intubation and Royal Flying Doctor Service transport to Perth, and a primary postpartum haemorrhage; our small-group teaching with our three amazing mentors; forming relationships with patients at the Aboriginal Health Service; and watching my husband play footy on the weekend for the local Derby Tigers.

I am the proudest of St Mary's Old Girls and feel so humbled and overjoyed to know that people connected to the School are so willing to provide this type of support. I cannot wait to give back in the same way to the School, which I love so dearly. Without this support, I would not have been able to participate in the RCSWA, which has ignited my passion for working rurally and contributing to resourcing remote communities in WA.

The Bonny Milne Scholarship is for Old Girls studying medicine and who demonstrate an outstanding and ongoing contribution to the community. This scholarship has been made possible by a gift from an anonymous donor.





Giving 2021

Spirit of St Mary's Scholarship

Just days prior to being hospitalised following a motor vehicle accident, Sally Hicks, our beloved Centenary Head Girl, spoke with Principal, Mrs Judith Tudball, and School Chaplain, Father Richard Pengelley, about the Class of 2021's leaving gift to the School.

Sally proposed a wonderful idea: the creation of an educational scholarship, on behalf of the 2021 Year 12 cohort, to help others.

Following the accident, the mothers of our 2021 Senior Day Girl and Senior Boarder pledged to honour Sally's vision and kindly asked their fellow Year 12 families to donate to a scholarship that would initially be known as the *Spirit of St Mary's* Scholarship.

It was their hope that the scholarship would grow over time and be the Class of 2021's legacy to the School.

Needless to say, the families of our 2021 Year 12 students rallied behind the cause and raised a staggering \$26,800 for the *Spirit of St Mary's* Scholarship. Once our benevolent St Mary's community learned about their generosity, staff, Old Girls and generous donors also contributed bringing the total sum raised to \$82,387.

On behalf of the entire St Mary's community, we wish to thank everyone who contributed to the *Spirit of St Mary's* Scholarship. We are also pleased to announce that this special scholarship will continue to grow – as was the wish of our 2021 cohort – and will be open for donations for many years to come.
