Proud of our legacy of academic excellence, St Mary's is grounded in Anglican faith and a strong sense of community. At St Mary's, every student is supported by passionate, experienced staff who bring out the best in each girl within our inclusive and nurturing environment.

The St Mary's Anglican Girls' School has an extensive and diverse Music Department, which provides opportunities for girls from Kindergarten to Year 12 to perform in orchestras, choirs, bands and other ensembles. In addition to approximately 30 peripatetic music staff there are also 98 members of staff across the Junior School and Senior School.

All girls receive music classes in the Junior School and in Years 7 and elective music classes are available in Years 8, 9 and 10 and as an ATAR subject.

ROLE

The Peripatetic Music Teacher (Violin and/or Viola) delivers individual tuition across Junior and Senior Schools and leads group lessons in Years 3–4. The Junior group program is Kodály-inspired, cultivating musical foundations through active music-making, while individual lessons develop technique, musical expression, and performance.



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RESPONSIBILITIES

Responsibilities for this role include:

- Plan and deliver engaging, well-sequenced violin and/or viola lessons that foster musical growth across all levels, from beginner group classes to advanced individual tuition.
- Use a variety of effective teaching strategies that respond to the diverse learning needs and strengths of students.
- Create inclusive, supportive, and encouraging learning environments that nurture confidence and enjoyment in music-making.
- Contribute to and support the school's broader co-curricular music program.
- Uphold the School's Code of Conduct and all relevant policies.
- Other duties as may be required.
