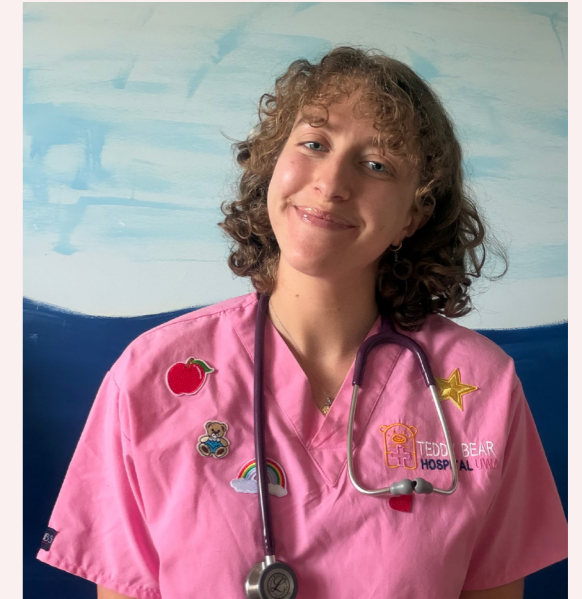
I am so incredibly grateful for all of the opportunities I have been afforded and sincerely thank all the donors for their support.

Old Girl Scholarships

Nalani Gleeson ('19) is grateful for the Bonny Milne Scholarship for Medicine which has opened up experiences that are guiding her choice of medical specialty.

Being awarded the Bonny Milne Scholarship for Medicine in 2025 has allowed me to reconnect with what inspired me to pursue medicine in the first place – helping others and making a real difference in my community. Thanks to the scholarship support I have been able to dedicate more time to volunteering and professional development. Since receiving the scholarship, I have volunteered as a tutor for children from migrant and refugee backgrounds, supported children on the autism spectrum through Ocean Heroes, and developed a strong passion for rural healthcare through initiatives such as Teddy Bear Hospital. I have also been able to attend educational conferences that have provided valuable clinical insight and helped shape my future pathway as a doctor.



Science, Enterprise, Technology and Innovation Centre

The Science, Enterprise, Technology and Innovation (SETI) Centre is now taking clear physical shape on our school grounds – it is a bold investment in the future learning of our students.

For the first time, science, enterprise, technology and innovation will come together under one roof. Purpose designed, innovative and collaborative spaces will provide the girls with a learning environment that will empower them flourish in an increasingly STEM-focused world.

The Centre will house four purpose designed technology laboratories and seventeen specialist science laboratories, alongside flexible collaborative areas that together support students' hands on, inquiry based learning and cross disciplinary thinking.

The School, together with the St Mary's Foundation has made significant investment to fund the construction and core infrastructure of the SETI Centre.

The internal learning environment will be realised through the SETI Capital Campaign and we invite you to partner with us in bringing this state-of-the-art Centre to life.

The generosity of donors will shape the laboratories and collaborative learning spaces where students will spend their days learning, experimenting and exploring ideas. These are the spaces that will transform the Centre into a place of impact, providing exceptional facilities for our girls to develop the critical thinking and collaboration required in the wider world.

“Thanks to donations to the Library Fund, we were able to purchase the new study booths – and they’ve been a big hit with students. Whether they’re studying, working together on small group projects, or playing games at lunchtime, the café-style booths are a great fit for the way our students like to connect.

“The idea came from a tour of Perth universities and public libraries, where we looked at current trends in library layouts and seating. Our library hosts a wide range of activities, so we were keen to see how other

organisations create spaces that work well for young people. We came away with plenty of inspiration, but the study booths at the University of Western Australia really stood out – and we were excited to recreate that feel here.

Honouring Leadership: The Opening of the Lynne Thomson Centre

In August 2025, the St Mary’s community came together to pay tribute to the leadership and enduring legacy of former Principal, Mrs Lynne Thomson, with the naming of the Creative Arts and Design Centre in her honour.

Mrs Thomson’s legacy as Principal from 1997-2018 is etched across the St Mary’s campus. From the Lady Wardle Performing Arts Centre to St Mary’s at Metricup, the numerous capital development projects undertaken during her tenure transformed the learning environment.

Mrs Thomson’s enduring connection to the School continues with her service on the Foundation Board of Management and as a generous donor.



Living Our Values: Students Giving Back

In 2025, our students lived the School's values of compassion and service through a wide range of charitable initiatives supporting the Western Australian community.

While donors generously support St Mary's, our girls, in turn, are actively supporting those in need across WA.

Among many initiatives over the year, Senior School students fundraised for the World's Greatest Shave, raising a record \$95,000, and donated clothing toiletries and essential items to Stirling Women's Refuge. In the Junior School, students embraced dress-up days raising funds for the Cambodian Children's Fund and Little Things for Tiny Tots.

Through these experiences, students develop a deeper understanding of social responsibility, leadership and the impact of collective action. St Mary's is committed to educating young women who not only benefit from the generosity of others, but who are deeply motivated to give back and make a meaningful difference within their own community.
